Dear Families,

We have lots of news to share with you about the building work which has been taking place on the main site at KTS and KTS+. During the Easter holidays we had all of the toilets at KTS+ refurbished and astro-turf put down in the quad, to make it accessible in all weathers.

On the main site the Eco Build is almost complete, we are just waiting for a bespoke balustrade which will be fitted at half-term. Red and Pink class will be in the new classrooms after half-term. We are really pleased with how amazing the building looks and a huge thanks you the building company, TG Escapes. The buses will then go back to parking on the playground each morning. Hopefully there will be some more parking spaces for parents, however there will also be vehicles for the nursery/reception building work, so please be vigilant when using the car park.

During half-term the building work will start on remodelling the old Red and Pink classrooms to make them into a nursery and reception provision, with a separate entrance for the nursery. The work will include; a toilet and changing area between the rooms, shared areas which will include a kitchen, storage, a wet area for art and messy play activities and an outdoor area. We hope that this work will be finished by October. Initially the reception and nursery classes will be based in other classrooms, but we hope to have them moved in as soon as we can.









This half-term started with a group of pupils from U1 and U2 visiting Kirkleatham Hall School to play football against their team. KTS demonstrated amazing teamwork skills, supporting and encouraging their fellow players. Although they lost 7-4, they were gracious in defeat and we straight way looking forward to the rematch at KTS.

It was lovely to see all of the classes across school celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III in a variety of different ways. There was picnics, crown making, a barbeque and lots and lots of cake! Thank you to the parents who joined us for the activities on the main site for their family event.

We continue to introduce our pupils to different activities which support their PfA (Preparing for Adulthood) organised by Lauren P. For some of our pupils this is about finding out about the different jobs and roles and other just love the experiences. The emergency services and Meadow Croft have definitely a hit with everyone! Purple class have also had a visit from Chance the Caremark Therapy dog.






