Although it has only been a short half term our pupils have still managed to take part in some fantastic learning opportunities. Thank you to those families who are engaging with communication through Class Dojo. Big Wide World

This half terms topic has been 'Big Wide World' or 'All Around the World'. Here is what some of our classes have been getting up to!

As part of the topic 'Big Wide World', U9 have enjoyed exploring different types of foods from around the world. The students decided on 5 recipes they would like to prepare and try. This included Tacos, Apple Strudel, Homemade Pasta (which was very difficult but turned out delicious!), Green Thai Curry and finally Lemon and Garlic Wedges with Coleslaw. The students have worked really hard during their independent living sessions and it has been great watching them being willing to try new foods.

Purple class enjoyed exploring the topic 'all around the world' by visiting different countries each week, learning a little bit about each country through their senses. They visited France, Italy, India & America.

Some of their favourite activities have been; painting with Indian spices, making pizzas, printing with spaghetti paintbrushes, dancing to cultural music, baking bread rolls, creating patterns with pasta, tasting Indian food, country themed attention to autism sessions and decorating pancakes!

Student Council

On 7th February 2024, members of the School Council/RRSA Steering Group attended a session led by officers from Redcar and Cleveland Council to learn about ways to save electricity and look after our environment. Lizzie Kemp (Energy officer) promoted a 'Switch Off' campaign, which would involve students switching of unnecessary lights and encouraging staff to switch off whiteboards and computers at the end of the day. John McSorley led a recycling sorting game to teach students what can and cannot be recycled. He was very impressed with students' knowledge. Iulia loana filmed students sorting recycling. The resulting video will be used to promote recycling in Redcar and Cleveland. Paul Murphy (Countryside Manager) talked about the importance of planting trees. David Rutherford has been working closely with KTS and is to publish posters produced by school council members in a forthcoming council newsletter. All the members of the school council are keen to put these ideas into practice. They continue to recycle every week in school.


Pre-loved uniform
